As I've done in the past, I've written about lives being changed at the National Home because of the great vision of the forefathers of this facility. Here's James and Samatha's Story.

James had moved 59 times before turning 16 and knew little about stability. By the age of 15, he was on his own. In contrast, Samatha had a challenging upbringing until she moved with her mother to the VFW National Home, which she described as the most stable place she has ever been.

At 17, facing a lack of support, James enlisted into the Army National Guard. After his service, he returned to Portland as a single dad struggling to make ends meet. His stepfather informed him about the VFW National Home, and in January of 2021, James moved to Eaton Rapids, where he found secure housing and dependable childcare. This allowed him to enroll in a cyber security program at Lansing Community College.

While attending the First Baptist Church, he met Samatha, his daughter's Sunday school teacher. Their relationship blossomed, leading to marriage, and Samatha moved in with James at the VFW National Home. Together, they worked hard to pay off debts and pursue their education.

Having recently welcomed a new son, they purchased their own home and expressed gratitude for the support they received. "The VFW National Home changed our lives," Samatha said. "It provides the stability we needed to thrive."
