Remember to update your websites, communicate with your members and include pictures in your social media and try to identify the people in the pictures and a time frame; continue to work on your scrapbooks/ journals and your newsletters.

It's suggested that when you post things on FaceBook to use the hashtag - #auxiliariesinaction That way National can see your posts and they might share them on their feed. When your "thoughts" are posted on FaceBook remember that a Story lasts only 24 hours, but if posted on a Feed, then they're there until you remove them. FaceBook and Instagram go hand in hand.
