## VFW AUXILIARY LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM SEPTEMBER 2023 SUNFLOWER EXPRESS

This month we are focusing on Suicide Awareness Month. As part of the Health Care portion of the VFW Priority Goals, we must ensure service members and veterans receive timely access to high-quality health care without increasing cost shares. Congress, VA (Veterans Administration) and DOD (Department of Defense) must reduce the number of service members and veterans who die by suicide to zero, and also strengthen care and research for mental health and traumatic brain injuries.

According to the 2022 National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report, the number and rate of suicide deaths fell in 2019 and 2020 for Veterans, for non-Veteran U.S. adults, and for U.S. adults overall. The VA conducts the largest National analysis of Veteran suicide rates each year. The report is based on National death certificate data currently available from 2001 through 2020. Among Veterans between ages 18-44, suicide was the second-leading cause of death. The average number of Veteran suicides per day rose from 16.4 in 2001 to 16.8 in 2020. It was highest in 2018 (18.6 per day). In 2020 the rate for Veterans was 57.3% higher than that of non-Veteran adults.
