More than 1.6 million children are faced with unique challenges and experiences due to their parents being deployed. Often times active-duty military families move every 2-3 years which can put a lot of strain on everyone. Sometimes we get in the habit of hearing a bunch of acronyms year after year in meetings and reports but might not really know what they mean. In a previous Sunflower Express I talked about MAP, Unmet Needs, and Sport Clips Help-a-Hero, so now it's time for another important one. So...

Do you know what NVS is?

NVS stands for National Veterans Service, a program that the VFW set up to help navigate confusing or difficult claims with the VA. It is a nationwide network made up of over 2,000 VFW Accredited Service Officers that are there to help veterans and their families. They are highly trained and trusted individuals that help free of charge and try to prevent anyone one getting caught in a scam or with someone that will charge a boatload of money. They work on a case-by-case basis so you get personalized assistance to your situation. You can get help with disability, pension, rehabilitation, employment programs and more. Well versed in the current laws, regulations, and legislation, VFW Accredited Officers have recouped more than \$13 billion in compensation and pension on behalf of veterans and eligible family members in 2023.
